Each term finishes at 2pm on the last day of term and we finish at 12 noon on the last day of the year.




Ways to keep in Touch: There are many ways to keep in touch with what is happening at school. Please remember if your email, phone number or address changes please contact the school office.

Meet the Kaiako/whānau BBQ/Picnic Evening:

A great way to make some fresh connections between home and school and get the term/year off to a positive start. This is a relaxed meeting for the whānau of each class to view their children's class, meet their teacher/s and ask any questions about the year ahead. Save this date in your diaries: **Thursday 20th January 5:30pm to 7:30pm**.



Format of the Evening:

5.30pm - 6.30pm:

Families on rotation meeting their child's teacher in their classroom environment. Teachers share the class programme, routines, expectations and a bit about themselves. Whānau have an opportunity to ask questions.

6.30pm - 7.30pm:

This year we thought we would try something different and have an opportunity to have a picnic on our field **after** you have been in the classroom environment and met your child's/children's teacher. This is an opportunity to mix and mingle with other families as well as staff. Please bring your own picnic rug/drinks/plates/cutlery etc. so you can take your own dishes home at the end. The Board will be selling sausages/bread and a small amount of soft drinks. This is an alcohol free event so please respect this.

Meet the teacher – each teacher will be in their class to do a 20 - 30 minute presentation about their class programme. It is helpful for your child to attend these meetings with you.

You will have noticed on the Taratoa Street side of the school there is a lot of building construction going on from the housing around the school and especially across the road from the school.

We ask that you drop your children or child off on the side of the road closest to the school and **DO NOT** stop in the school driveway as we will have trucks coming and going as well from our lower block demolition. Please be careful also on Tripoli Road as the apartments are going up and driveways will be made over the next few weeks and there will be further yellow no parking markings to be aware of. Please ensure your child comes to school on time and is also picked up by 3pm each day. As we are

a small school most children are off the school grounds by 2:50pm.

School Lunch: All our students are able to have lunch provided for them by the Ministry of Education for free. If your child has special dietary needs and the office is not aware of it, please contact the office and let us know.

We have a new lunch provider, School Lunch Collective, who will be providing our school. Our last provider, Kiwi Canteen, was excellent and we did not want to change and neither did they but due to government decisions we have had no choice. This is not a compulsory part of our school. You can still bring your own lunch to school if you would like and you can also have school lunch and some lunch from home.





Fruit in Schools: Fruit delivery will resume in Week 3 when our students will be given free fruit at morning tea time. In the meantime, we ask that you send your child to school with a piece of fruit for morning tea in Weeks 1 and 2.



School Hats: The sun is getting hotter and hotter each day in summer. At Ruapōtaka School we do not allow students to play in the sun without any hat on. School hats can be purchased at the school office. Please make sure your child has a school hat to wear at school. We **recommend** they leave their school hat at school and have a mufti hat to wear to and from school. All students going on school trips must wear a school hat. All students

who want to play in the new sandpit will also need to have a hat on.



School Student Stationery: Stationery packs are available at the school office. We have had to unfortunately, increase the price of some of the packs from last year due to the increased prices from Office Max who provide our stationery. The prices of the stationery packs for each classroom is:

Please purchase your child's stationery as soon as possible if you have not already, so your child can be ready for their learning.



School Uniforms: You will need to go to NZ Uniforms in Botany. You can order your uniform online and they will deliver it to your home or you will need to visit the store in Botany Junction. We do not have a summer and winter uniform but all our uniform pieces can be mixed and matched. Years 0-6 wear royal blue uniform and our Year ^{7/8} will wer navy blue uniforms. Please make sure you purchase the correct

coloured uniform for your child.



Term 1 Swimming: This term we have swimming as part of our Physical Education Curriculum. It is a compulsory part of the curriculum and we encourage all our tamariki to come to school every day with their togs and towel. At Ruapōtaka School the Year 3-6 students will have the opportunity to have an instructor for 10 lessons to teach them how to swim, although our teachers are more than capable of teaching as well. Our Year 7/8 are too big to learn swimming skills in the pool but will use it to play some water sports



and to cool down during the day, so they will also need to bring their togs and towels to school. If your child does not have togs, they may wear shorts and a tight fitting tshirt than a loose fitting one. Please remember to name all your child's togs, tshirts, underwear, towels. It is surprising how much clothing is left behind at the end of the day.



Important Dates for Term 1: There are many extra activities that happen over the term and some activities are regular throughout the year. Here are a few to remember:

Newsletters: These come out to the eldest and only in hard copy each fortnight in Weeks 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9.

Whole School Assemblies: These also happen fortnightly during the same weeks as the newsletters come out. All whānau are invited to attend any of these assemblies. Assemblies start at 9:15am this year.

Frozen Fridays: We are having these again this year every Friday ice blocks will be on sale at \$2.00 each. Students pick these up on the way home on Friday from the school staffroom.

Wellbeing Wednesdays: All staff and students are expected to be off site by 3pm each Wednesday. This is an opportunity for our staff to work on their wellbeing. There will be a staff member who will remain onsite until the last child is picked up. Please do not be late picking up your children.
