Learning Focus for Term 1: Our focus this term is "Getting to Know Us," with an emphasis on the curriculum areas of Health and Physical Education, where we will be focusing on the strand relationships with others, and in Music our students will be exploring and expressing musical ideas. This is part of our overarching theme for the year- **"Manaakitanga"**. Each class will have swimming lessons this term. Our students will also be participating in the Tamaki Cluster sports tournaments.

Celebrating Our Learning

Room 1: Room 1 brought their 'A game''this week. From day one we settled in and organised our learning journey, the roles and responsibilities we all have this term and welcomed two new students to our school. Room 2: Welcome dear whanau. It is lovely how students have settled in Room 2. We have been exploring our school and getting to the new place. They have been engaging in different activities and building confidence in their learning. Room 2 has been practising writing their names and enhancing their pencil grips. We were lucky to go to the swimming pool and have fun in the warm weather.



Room 3: "Fale Fun" Room 3 could hardly wait to go and check out our new school fale, Since the start of our school year the students have eagerly watched the construction process and now they could finally enjoy it!!! We brought our library books along and settled in for a cozy reading session. Room 3 enjoyed their time and suggested that next time, we should bring our bean bags for extra comfort!



Room 4: Students listened to a conductor's rhythm and the "orchestra" responded. They also listened to music ranging from peaceful lullabies through to exciting marches and expressed their emotions through gestures. There was some creative music-note writing as well.



Room 5: Our tamariki have had an awesome start to term one with introductions and weaving 'Manaakitanga' in our learning. We kicked off with 'getting to know each other activities',music rhythm and beat, swimming, reading and writing letters to our future selves. Next week our year 7 students will be going down to technology at Tamaki College and engage in rugby training sessions every Friday afternoon. Ka pai to mahi room 5!



Room 6: It was a pleasure to welcome our lovely students in Room 6. They have been engaging in a range of activities around Reading, Writing and Mathematics over the last few days. The writing focus has been, "Myself and My Family. We have also had many discussions around showing manaakitanga and being kind to each other. The children were very eager to start their swimming lessons on Tuesday. We have swimming every Tuesday and Friday.



STEAM Classes:

We are excited to begin our STEAM lessons. The junior classes will be learning about habitats - what we need in our habitats both at school and at home, and also what our native birds will need in their habitats. The senior classes are learning about the science of music. How loudness and pitch can be shown in sound waves, and how to use this knowledge to make our own instruments.

Special School Events

Swimming: Term 1 has seen the hot weather be more consistent across the term and we are lucky that we have a school pool. Classes are allocated a time to go swimming and swimming is a compulsory part of our curriculum. It is important that every child in Aotearoa learns how to swim and be safe around water. Please ensure they bring their swimming togs and a towel to school every day. They will need a separate bag to keep them in. Teach your children how to get dressed and undressed quickly. Togs are not required for swimming but if you choose to buy some, please put their name on it and it is your child's responsibility to look after them.

Meet the Kaiako/whānau BBQ/Picnic Evening:

A great way to make some fresh connections between home and school and get the term/year off to a positive start. This is a relaxed meeting for the whānau of each class to view their children's class, meet their teacher/s and ask any questions about the year ahead. Save this date in your diaries: **Thursday 20th February 5:30pm to 7:30pm**.

Format of the Evening: 5.30pm - 6.30pm:

Families on rotation meeting their child's teacher in their classroom environment. Teachers share the class programme, routines, expectations and a bit about themselves. Whānau have an opportunity to ask questions.

6.30pm - 7.30pm:

This year we thought we would try something different and have an opportunity to have a picnic on our field **after** you have been in the classroom environment and met your child's/children's teacher. This is an opportunity to mix and mingle with other families as well as staff. Please bring your own picnic rug/drinks/plates/cutlery etc. so you can take your own dishes home at the end. The Board will be selling sausages/bread and a small amount of soft drinks. This is an alcohol free event so please respect this.

Meet the teacher – each teacher will be in their class to do a 20 - 30 minute presentation about their class programme. It is helpful for your child to attend these meetings with you.

Swimming:

Classes are now in the middle of swimming lessons. It is important that students, no matter what age they are, wear the correct clothing in the pool. The purpose of taking classes to use our swimming pool is to teach them how to swim and be safe in water. It is important that what they are wearing does not stretch from the water and that nothing can be seen underneath their clothing. Mufti clothes and school uniforms are



unacceptable to wear when you are trying to learn to swim. We expect the same clothing as you would wear in a public pool. Please also remember, **NO TOWEL NO SWIM.** Students will be expected to show their towel to their teacher before they go to the pool. There will be no sharing of towels as it may take a while for towels to dry if the sun is not shining.

Girls need to wear proper swimwear which can be purchased from the Warehouse for \$12.00. Rash shirts can also be purchased for girls and boys who want to cover up from the Warehouse, KMart, The photos below are from KMart or Warehouse. There is an affordable option.

Fakaalofa lahi atu kia mutolu oti and Kia Ora Koutou e te whānau. The holidays are like a distant memory for me. We have certainly hit the ground running from day 1.

A huge welcome to all our new families. To date we have had 15 new students enrol and attend our school, which is so great to see. This means the classroom sizes in some year levels will be getting bigger than 25 and as our classrooms are old and only small, it may mean that we will need to start another

classroom. The Ministry has funded our school for 130 students. Currently, we are at 131 students and we have another 3 students who have pre-enrolled and will start sometime this coming week. We have to have at least 140 for two weeks before we can ask the MoE for permission to recruit another teacher. So, it is very important that all new families in the area who are in our zone, enrol as soon as possible as it gives us time to ensure we have enough staff to accommodate the students.

With the weather getting hotter and hotter in the afternoons, it is important that your child comes to school with a hat and a water bottle. Please do not put any clothing under their uniform as we are noticing some students coming into the classroom after playing and becoming overheated.

Thank you again for your support. We are looking forward to meeting you all at the Meet the Whanau + Meet the Kaiako Evening coming up.
