### Celebrating Our Learning

In the meantime, check out what they have been doing...

**Room 1:** Wow, what an amazing last two weeks since our last newsletter. We have completed all our school wide assessments, camp whanau evenings and travelled to and back from camp. We had an incredible time, learning new skills and how working as a team you can accomplish anything. This coming week we'll be reflecting on our experiences and sharing in class, on our blogs and at our next school assembly.







**Room 2:** Room 2 has been learning about how to actively participate in learning and outdoor activities. They are settling in very well and love the big outdoors and challenge themselves to do all sorts of obstacles. In swimming we learnt kicking and going under water. We are also learning to use ipads for learning and enjoying "Moose Math" on it enhancing the counting skills.







**Room 3:** Exploring Onomatopoeia in Softball!

In class, we've been having a **blast** learning about onomatopoeic words and how they can bring our writing to life. We recently applied this to our softball stories, capturing the exciting sounds of the

game. From the crack of the bat hitting the ball to the whoosh of the ball zooming by, onomatopoeia helps us paint vivid pictures with words! The students have been getting creative, using these fun, descriptive words to make their writing more dynamic and engaging!

**Room 4:** The students have been learning how to recognise and articulate to explain what emotions others may be feeling. It is part of a Mitey - Mental Health programme that John Kirwan set up. The activities we've played use drama and visual art. Some drew a sun or lightning to represent moods.





**Room 5** The past couple of weeks have been busy for our senior tamariki and we are enjoying every moment of it. Our year 7's had an awesome time at camp down in Mangawhai making memories and creating new experiences. In class, we presented our super cool adventure guides sharing different forms of tone and text types, well done everyone! Room 5 has also been busy with the MITEY curriculum and learning about identity and uniqueness. We are looking forward to the cricket tournament, more swimming and music projects.







**Room 6:** We have been having a lot of discussions around "what makes a good friend?" and showing kindness to each other. The students have also been sharing about themselves in their writing and in their artwork. In our music sessions, we have had lots of fun playing different instruments and working in groups to create rhythm patterns.

#### **Swimming:**

Classes are now in the middle of swimming lessons. It is important that students, no matter what age they are, wear the correct clothing in the pool. The purpose of taking classes to use our swimming pool is to teach them how to swim and be safe in water. It is important that what they are wearing does not stretch from the water and that nothing can be seen underneath their clothing. Mufti clothes and school uniforms are



unacceptable to wear when you are trying to learn to swim. We expect the same clothing as you would wear in a public pool. Please also remember, NO TOWEL NO SWIM. Students will be expected to show their towel to their teacher before they go to the pool. There will be no sharing of towels as it may take a while for towels to dry if the sun is not shining.

Girls need to wear proper swimwear which can be purchased from the Warehouse for \$12.00. Rash shirts can also be purchased for girls and boys who want to cover up from the Warehouse, KMart, The photos below are from KMart or Warehouse. There is an affordable option.





















**Important Dates for Term 1:** There are many extra activities that happen over the term and some activities are regular throughout the year. Here are a few to remember:

The Year 7/8s have been preparing for their school camp up at Mangawhai Heads last week and they had such a great time, although exhausting, the children get lots and lots of life learning and team building. Thank you to the teachers and staff members who supported this event. We run camps every 2 years for the Year 7/8 students only. The cost of camps are so expensive so there is a lot of

fundraising that happens over the two years leading up to it. We could not let it happen without parent help and support. This year we have not had any parent helpers which makes it difficult for the school to supply enough adults to cover the activities. Each year we need 2-3 parents to attend camp. You don't have to pay and you don't run activities that you don't get training in. Please, please, please, to our **Year 5 and Year 6 parents this year, please consider being a camp parent helper in 2027**. We will need to police vet all parents who attend. Parent helpers do not pay for camp but your child will still need to pay and the price may be different to this year.

We are due to have a curriculum evening this term. Due to the busyness of the term we may leave it until the last week of the term. Please look out for this date in the coming weeks.
