

STEAM: In STEAM the students have been finishing up their learning for the term. The senior students have completed the Sound Amplification Engineering Challenge - they have used the engineering process to create an amplification device for a phone. The Junior students voted on the action their class will do, prompted by their learning around native birds that share our school habitat. Room 2 decided to plant a tree, Room 4 chose to make a sugar water feeder for Tuis and Room 6 voted to reduce predator numbers by setting a trap (we will complete these this week), we hope to increase

the number of native birds and their beautiful song around our school.

Important Notices and Reminders

Deodorant/Antiperspirant for Year 5-8 Students: As your child gets older and plays more and more sport, they will need deodorant or an antiperspirant to help them with their sweating. If you are looking for an antispirant, please use a "roll-on" rather than a "spray", as sprays can affect students and adults who also have hayfever or are susceptible to





hayfever. Also choose one that is not small so much as again this can affect students and adults with hay fever or asthma. They do not need to bring this item to school ever or any sprays or smelly items.
