### Celebrating Our Learning

In the meantime, check out what they have been doing...

**Room 1:** We have had a fantastic start to the term, kicking off with a couple of days of 100% attendance, what a great example of our commitment as learners! In writing, we have been exploring explanation texts, focusing on how and why things happen. During Kelly Sports, we have been developing our ki-o-rahi skills. This week we are excited to start our new TECH rotation at Tamaki College. Our Year 7 & 8s have also begun Kapa Haka with Whaea Gina and Whaea Cassandra. We had a fantastic celestial navigation session with Mrs Lagitupu, perfectly linking with our term topic on Astronomical Systems. We now look forward to a visit from BLAKE VR and the inspiring NED Show!









**Room 2:** Term 2 has started with lots of enthusiasm and fun. We have been learning about planets, stars and everything about our solar system. Tamarki have been working hard on their reading tasks as well. This week we made cards and bracelets for Mums for their special day. We also learnt about Rockets in our STEAM session. In Physical education we are practising our underarm and overarm throw skills.







**Room 3:** It's been a busy and exciting start to the term as we settle back into our school routines! We've been diving into *Mitey* and *PB4L*, focusing on building resilience and supporting each other to be our best selves. Kelly Sports has also been a hit, keeping us active and energised. Looking ahead, we're launching into our new discovery topic—**Astronomical Systems**. If your child starts rattling off fun facts about planets, stars, or how long it takes to get to the moon... that's why! Stay tuned—there's plenty more to come from the galaxy of Room 3.

Room 4 expressed their wonderment of our solar system by drawing colourful supernovas and comparing the relative sizes of the planets using adjectives such as "big, bigger, large, gigantic, massive and enormous. The above photo is of a space shuttle with labels pointing out combustion chambers and other parts. The boys particularly enjoyed this schematic art!



**Room 5:** We have had a productive start to term 2 as we focus on the solar system planets, sun, and moon for Discovery. We are enjoying planning our art projects and setting goals for the remainder of the term. The senior school is learning kio-rahi in the Kelly Sports programme and have been working really hard in reading and writing. We are currently focusing on explanation and recount writing for term 2. In maths we have been working on our division, times tables, and Prime books. We are looking forward to the Blake VR session, Rotuman Language Week, and more Kapa Haka practice. **Room 6:** We have launched enthusiastically into our Discovery topic, The Sun and the Solar System. We all know the names of the planets and we have been reading and writing about the sun this week. Room 6 is curious to learn more about our galaxy, the Milky Way. We are working hard on our Prime books. Our focus at the moment is addition and subtraction. We have also been continuing with the Mitely Programme. In visual art, Room 6 learnt about hot and cold colours and created a piece of art depicting autumn leaves.







**STEAM:** We have had a great start to term 2 in the STEAM room! The junior school has begun to learn about rockets. They made a puff rocket and started talking about forces that act on a rocket. They had lots of fun blowing air into the straw to make the rocket launch. The senior school began their exploration of Mars. They learnt about the engineering needed to ensure a safe landing on the planet Mars for the Mars rovers. They then had a chance to follow the engineering process and create a parachute that would help a weight to gently and safely land when dropped from the playground. This proved challenging and meant that testing and improving their designs was essential.

**Tamaki Cluster Football Day:** We had four teams participating in the football field day. Our students had a lot of fun on the day. It was the first time participating in an inter school tournament for our Year 3 students, who showed great resilience. It was an enjoyable day for all the students who participated. We would like to thank the parents who volunteered to manage two of the teams and others who came to support our tamariki.







**NED SHOW:** The NED Show is coming to our school to perform on Wednesday 14th May in the multi-purpose room. **NED's Resiliency Ride**, is a character education program that centers around three important messages that have lifelong relevance: Never give up, Encourage others and Do your best. During the assembly, students will learn about the importance of these three life skills while also enjoying storytelling, magic, humor and yo-yo tricks.
